private parts, the person can place their own hands on that part and you can place your hand on top of their hands, if you are of the same gender.

4. When ministering to someone with a sore or open wound or discharge, do not place your hand directly on the infected area. Have the person place their hand on or near the spot and put your hand on top of their hands.

C. Explain the possibility of someone praying in tongues (Mk 16:15-18, Acts 2:4, Jude 20, 1 Cor. 4:26).

D. Explain the possibility of the person experiencing manifestations of the Spirit's presence such as "falling under the Spirit's power, crying, trembling, laughing with joy.

E. In prayer, deal with only one problem at a time. Don't pray for every aspect of their problems in one prayer. Deal with each one individually.

F. Be bold in prayer (Lk. 10:19, Heb 4:16).

### 7. Encourage a positive attitude and strong faith walk.

- A. Encourage the person to continue in faith.
- B. Encourage them to read the Word and seek the Lord daily.
- C. Encourage a positive confession to fight discouragement and depression.
- D. Be sure to thank Jesus for their healing. Thanksgiving is important.
- E. Encourage them to praise and worship God daily.
- F. Encourage persistence, diligence and seeking for a deeper experience of God's presence.
- G. Explain the importance of developing a life lived according to God's will, pleasing to Him.

# HR Ministry Guidelines

**1. Your are an Ambassador for Jesus**, His representative to the sick. Always be reverent in His presence and bring honor to His name (II Cor. 5:20):

A. Dress well in modest attire. No shorts, short skirts, tight form fitting clothing, pictured T-shirts or sweat shirts, etc.

B. Display a positive attitude. Be encouraging and uplifting. Let your personal faith be supportive.

**2. Evaluate the sick person's healing needs:**

A. Ask what their problem is and be sure this is noted on the prayer need **Registration Form**. Explain we record this so that we can have a record of their healing.

B. We do not need medical details nor elaborate explanations.

C. Do not offer medical advice nor represent yourself as a counselor. There are strict laws governing the practice of medicine and counseling. Do not prescribe nor recommend medical treatment nor suggest that people go off their medication. When someone believes they have received a manifestation of healing, recommend they check it out by seeing their doctor.

**3. Evaluate the persons spiritual needs:**

A. Are they saved? If not minister salvation (John 3:16, Rom. 10:9-10, 13, 1 John 1:8-10 and 2:1-2).

B. How knowledgeable are they of the Word?

C. Are they churchd or not?

D. Spiritual problems can cause or complicate physical health problems. Address all barriers and roadblocks to healing that they may have.

Especially deal with doubt and unbelief by building faith in God's Word.

**4. Preparation for prayer ministry:**

A. Explain that the manifestation of healing can be instantaneous or it may come by process over a period of time. It is important to understand this to develop perseverance and avoid discouragement.

B. Help them understand we are committed to ministering to them until they are healed whether it takes days, weeks or months. Encourage them to accept the responsibility to contend for their healing. They must return in order for us to partner with them.

C. Encourage them to put their faith in action once you have prayed for them.

D. Before prayer, let them decide if they prefer to sit or stand. People with severe pain may need to sit. If they choose to stand, be sure a catcher stands behind them.

**5. Faith building through ministering the Word:**

A. Share the Word. Plant the seed of the Word (Luke 8:11, Mark 4:14).

B. Take as much time as necessary even if the first session is mostly sharing the Word and dealing with spiritual barriers to healing.

C. Explain that the Bible teaches:

1. God first revealed Himself as Jehovah Rapha our Healer (Ex. 15:26).

2. Jesus is Christ the Healer (Is. 53:4-6, Mt. 8:16-17, 1 Pet. 2:24).

3. Jesus healed all who came to Him in prevailing faith (Luke 6:19, Mt. 12:15, Luke 4:40, Mark 6:56, Mt. 14:35-36).

4. We can come to Jesus to receive

from Him (Heb. 13:8).

5. We can ask of the Father in Jesus name and if we ask according to His will we can expect to receive from Him (1 Jn. 5:14-15)

6. When we ask, we must believe that we receive and not doubt nor waver. Our faith must be a NOW faith (Mk. 11:22-24, James 1:5-8).

7. No sickness or disease is too difficult for Jesus to heal (Mt. 9:35, 4:23-24). With God all things are possible (Mk. 10:27).

8. Jesus is present NOW to heal where two or three are gathered together in His name (Mt. 18:20).

9. The Holy Spirit lives in believers and is powerfully present (Jn. 14:17).

10. When we fulfill God's will and do all we can, we must stand in faith (Ep. 6:13).

Don't throw away your confidence (Heb 10:35)

**6. Ministering through Prayer:**

A. Explain that we will anoint with oil according to James 5:14-15.

B. Explain that we will lay hands upon them according to Luke 16:15-18.

1. Do not lay hands on the person until the Holy Spirit leads.

2. Place your hands as near to the problem area as possible. 3. If the sickness is in the persons'
